Statement of Faith

- 1. We believe the Bible to be the inspired, the only infallible, authoritative word of God (II Timothy 3:15-16, II Peter 1:21). *(1)
- 2. We believe there is one God, eternally existent in three persons Father, Son and Holy Spirit (Genesis 1:1, Matthew 28:19, John 10:30).
- 3. We believe in the deity of Christ (John 10:33); His virgin birth (Isaiah 7:14, Matthew 1:23, Luke 1:35); His sinless life (Hebrews 4:15, 7:26); His miracles (John 2:11); His vicarious and atoning death (I Corinthians 15:3, Ephesians 1:7, Hebrews 2:9); His Resurrection (John 11:25, I Corinthians 15:4); His Ascension to the right hand of the Father (Mark 16:19); His personal return in power and glory (Acts 1:11, Revelation 19:11).
- 4. We believe in the absolute necessity of regeneration by the Holy Spirit for salvation because of the sinful nature of man, and that men are justified on the single ground of faith in the shed blood of Christ and that only by God's grace and through faith alone we are saved (John 3:16-19, 5:24, Romans 3:23, 5:8-9, Ephesians 2:8-10, Titus 3:5). *(2)
- 5. We believe in the spiritual unity of all who believe in our Lord Jesus Christ (Romans 8:9, I Corinthians 12:12-13, Galatians 3:26-28).
- 6. We believe in the present ministry of the Holy Spirit by whose indwelling the Christian is enabled to live a godly life (Romans 8:13-14, I Corinthians 3:16, 6:19-20, Ephesians 4:30, 5:18).
- 7. God wonderfully creates each person as male or female. These two distinct, complementary genders together reflect the image and nature of God. Marriage was designed by God to be the union of one genetic man and one genetic woman. (Gen 1:26-27; Gen 2:20-24, Mark 10-2-9; Hebrews 13:4).

Clarification of doctrinal statements:

- *(1)The Bible is the Old and New Testament and constitutes the *only* rule of Christian faith and practice. We specifically mean that we do not accept any other testaments, documents or revelations claiming similar divine inspiration. We consider any other such claims to be false and heretical.
- *(2)We believe that the salvation process comes by grace, through faith alone. Works of any kind are a result of salvation, not in any way a means to it (Ephesians 2:8-9).

NOTE: Member schools of the Association of Christian Schools International (ACSI) of which Cornerstone Christian School, Inc. is a member, make no distinction concerning an individual's race, ethnic or socioeconomic background because we acknowledge that there can be no preferential treatment with God (Romans 2:11). We are bound to extend our ministry to others in order to embrace our Lord's Great Commission (Matthew 28:18).

Philosophy

Cornerstone Christian School History

Cornerstone Christian School began in 1995 with three children. The school was founded on the belief that the Christian faith should penetrate all aspects of our lives, including the education of our children. The school quickly outgrew its home basement roots and moved to rental space at Congregational Presbyterian Church in 1996.

Further growth required additional rental space at River City Church in 2001. In August of 2006 the school moved to the current location at First Church of the Nazarene. Since 2010 enrollment has been stable at over 100 students and 14 teachers. CCS has staff and students representing 20 area churches. God has been faithful by providing incredible teachers, faithful families and wonderful spaces.



Mission and Vision


Mission:



Dismissal Times

Your family's school dismissal is at 2:00, 2:05 or 2:10 depending on your oldest child. Please do not enter the pick up loop until your appointed time. Students who have not been picked up by 10 minutes after their scheduled time should be picked up in their classroom. Consistent late pick-up will incur a late charge of \$1.00 per minute after the scheduled time. If you incur any late charges, a bill will be sent to you at the beginning of the next month.

Tardiness

Our classes begin promptly at 8:00. We request that parents are respectful by having students at school ready to begin at 8:00, but should not be dropped off before 7:45. A tardy student disrupts class, feels conspicuous and misses valuable class time. Consistent tardiness is deemed disrespectful to our teachers and may effect a student's grade.

Absences, Illnesses, Injuries

- Consistent attendance is important.
- Instruction missed by absence can never truly be made up.
 - O Class time, teacher instruction, class interaction are impossible to duplicate.
- Absences create extra work for teacher and students.
 - o Missed work will be completed in a timely manner.
- Planned absence
 - O Work can be sent along and all work must be completed.
 - O Send a note or email—do not rely on student to inform teachers.
- Absence due to Illness
 - $\, o \,$ Students should remain home for 24 hours fever free without medication following an illness.
 - Please phone or email the school if your child is ill.
 - O In case of illness, work will be assigned and completed at the teacher's discretion.
 - O Work can be sent with a sibling or can be picked up in the school office.
- Parents need to communicate limitations and abilities when a child has had an injury or serious illness.

Signing Students Out During the School Day

A student will not be allowed to leave school without parental permission. If a student leaves during the school day due to illness, doctor or dentist appointments, etc., the parent comes to the office to sign out their student. When the student returns to school the parent signs them back in through the office. There is a sign-out/sign-in clip board under the tuition box in the office. We would appreciate it if you can make your appointments during our school breaks.

THE ME

LUNCHES

Children will bring their own sack lunches. We have microwaves available for warmups (two minutes or less). Pop, "Mix-Ins", and caffeinated drink are not allowed unless expressly specified on special occasions. Once a week students may purchase a pizza lunch from school. This is a fundraiser for our 8th grade students' trip.

Snow days will generally follow Lewiston Public Schools. However, we **may** make a decision outside of this general policy. Once teachers are notified we will send an all school email by 6:30 a.m. Teachers will also send a text to their class. A snow day will be posted on the CCS app and on the school website ccslewiston.com.

If it looks "iffy" check your email and your smart phone.

- Tuition can be paid in three different payment schedules: (*example of \$3,300 tuition)
 - \$330 per month beginning in August and ending in May.
 (*Tuition is due by the 5th each month, except in August by the 20th.*)
 - 2. \$1,650 in August, \$1,650 in January.
 - 3. \$3,300 in August.
- A tuition late fee of \$25.00 will be charged after the 10th of each month. Please notify the administrator if you will have a late tuition. A delinquency of greater than two months may result in dismissal of the student, at the discretion of the Board.

 We do not send out monthly tuition statements and parents are expected to stay current. The cost to educate each student is \$3,900. The tuition paid and the \$3,900 must be made up through fundraising and donations by each family.

Political Statement

Although we respect our school families' opinions on political issues, we do not allow solicitation or distribution of any political materials. As a rule, all outside materials are required to go through the administrative team.

Our school's curriculum is based on a Christian worldview and we teach about the Christian foundation of the American government. However, we do not take a political stand or platform.

We feel that part of our witness is found in how we respond in society. Civil governments are of divine appointment for the interests and good order of human society. Those in civil authority are to be prayed for and conscientiously honored and obeyed except in things contrary to the Word of God. (Romans 13:1-7; Il Samuel 23:3; Exodus 18:21-22; Acts 4:19-20, 5:20, 23:5; Matthew 22:21; Daniel 3:17-18).



School Board

The school board is comprised of seven members. Two of the members are founding members of the school, two are appointed positions and three are elected by parents. The founding members are Marv Kym and Cyndy Kym. The appointed positions are Chris Kessler and Lynn Ridinger. The elected members are Ryan King, Willie Wicks, LoraLee Morgenstern. Elections take place in February/March of each year. The board meets approximately three times a year.

Tax Deductible Donations

THE BEST DEAL EVER!!! IDAHO TAX RETURN DONATIONS For anyone filing an Idaho Tax Return

We are a 501 c-3 corporation. Any donations above registration & tuition qualify for the Idaho Tax Credit.

How do you do this?

- Make a donation to CCS (up to \$2000/filing jointly is eligible, \$1,000 if filing single)
- Put the amount you donated in the space. Keep your receipt from us.
 What does Idaho do?

They allow a credit reducing your Idaho tax. Here's how they get the amount— The credit is limited to the smallest of:

- One-half of the amount donated
- 50% of the tax on Form 40, line 21
- \$500 (single) or \$1,000 (joint return)
- The tax on Form 40, line 21 less the amount on Form 40, line 22

What if I am able to itemize? Federal and State deductions apply! In the 12% IRS bracket, you would save an <u>additional</u> 12% of your contribution (in the 22% bracket, 22% of your contribution). PLUS your contribution times your ldaho tax bracket (up to 5.8%).



DONATIONS

Approximately \$23,000 of last year's budget was provided by individual donations last year. Since we are a nonprofit organization, all donations are tax deductible. If you or people you know (grandparents, etc.) desire to further support Cornerstone with donations, they would be gladly accepted.

Operating Funds

Our donation fundraising goal is \$90,000 yearly

Additional funds raised over operating funds are met will go toward classroom improvements.



Field Trips

Any parent driving for a field trip is required to have a copy of their car insurance on file in the school office. It is mandatory that you do not play movies in the vehicle and that you play only Christian music/radio or Odyssey CD's in your car. Each student must wear a seat belt and age appropriate car seat and students under 13 may not ride in the front seat.





The purpose of our monthly **chapel** is to give our students an opportunity to share their gifts and talents in a public setting for the blessing and encouragement of their schoolmates and families. We seek to glorify God in all we do and appreciate your participation in this primarily student led endeavor.

We believe that a child's education is the responsibility of the parents. It is mandatory, therefore, that parents are involved in the functions of the school in the following ways:

- 1. A minimum of twenty (20) hours of donated time will be required by each family each year. The purpose of this is two-fold: one is to keep parents involved in their child's day, and the second is to help contain costs. Any family not able to serve their twenty hours will be charged an hourly rate of \$20/hour at the conclusion of the school year. Hardship exceptions to this will be decided by the administrative team on a case by case basis.
- 2. Parents are expected to **check email and folders daily** for school information, event information, updates, homework and teacher/parent communications. Fourth through eighth grade parents are expected to monitor their child's work online through "**SchoolCues**".
- 3. The students present a chapel service monthly. Parents are always invited and encouraged to attend to support our children in their spiritual development.
- 4. Homework will be sent home regularly. Though we encourage children to be responsible for their own work, we expect parents to spend time monitoring and encouraging them.
- 5. Parents will maintain responsibility for the discipline of their child. This involves signing discipline notes and being available for conferences and meeting with the teacher when necessary.

ACADEMICS

All subjects at CCS are presented in the light of biblical truth.

Science courses are taught from a creationist point of view since we believe that "In the beginning, God created..."

Mathematics are not taught as an invention of man, but from God, a mirror which reflects His order and reliability in a unique way.

Historical time-lines are set in the perspective of God's plan for the ages. We evaluate the impact of biblical principles and of individual Christian faith on major historical themes such as exploration, colonization, economic progress, art, literature, and constitutional government.

Language arts are taught so as to enhance and apply the values of the Christian faith. Because men are influenced by words, and all words communicate some value system, we strive to select and evaluate literature in the light of Biblical values. We also give priority to mastery of the written and spoken word.

Bible classes are an integral part of the CCS curriculum. God's truth is "...profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, for training in righteousness, that the man of God may be adequate, equipped for every good work." (II Timothy 3:16,17)



PRE-ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Parents must support the school and students with the requirement that all students behave according to biblical principles while in school.
- Parents must desire the type of education from a Christian worldview their child(ren) will receive at Cornerstone.
- Parents and students must agree to obey all rules, policies and procedures of CCS without discord.
- Parents must read the handbook prior to the admission of the student.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

- 1. Read the CCS handbook.
- 2. Observe in a classroom if possible.
- 3. Fill out a registration form and return to the office with the registration fee.
- 4. All new students will be screened prior to admission.
- 5. A parent interview may be required.
- 6. After review of the application documents by the administrative team, a letter notifying acceptance/denial will be mailed. These will be mailed by April 19.
- 7. All information concerning the beginning of school will be emailed the beginning of August.



BACKGROUND CHECKS



Part of our rental agreement with the Nazarene Church requires that any adult who volunteers at the school must have a background check. This includes any activity around the students, i.e...driving for field trips, helping with school parties, and volunteering in a classroom. The purpose of the background check is to protect our children, our school and the church we are renting.

The background check consists of ID verification, court record searches focusing on felony convictions, drug convictions and sex offences for the states of Washington and Idaho. The cost is \$25 for each background check.

All background checks done by other businesses are sealed and are nontransferable, including those done by CCS. Our kids are our most valued treasure. We want to do everything we can to protect them.





Letter grades reflect a student's performance in relation to the objective given:

90%-100%: A 80%-89%: B 70%-79%: C 60%-69%: D Below 60%: F

Letter grades are not given as comparative to the others in the class, or on a "bell curve." Therefore, it is possible for all students to receive the same grade.

RECOMMENDED ACADEMIC WITHDRAWAL

Students who have struggled academically may not be able to handle the increased workload at the next grade level. If this is the case, and the school is unable to accommodate the academic needs of the student, the school may recommend withdrawal so the student may consider another school option where more academic success can be found.



Report Card

GRADING POLICIES

There are three grading periods in the school year. These are denoted on the school calendar.

Kindergarten through second grade are evaluated by mastery of essential skills and progress is reported by the teacher's documentation. These classes do not have letter grades.

Beginning in third grade, letter grades are given in a few subjects and in fourth grade letter grades of A,B,C,D and F are given for all areas with objective assessments. Areas with subjective materials are reported with teacher comments. Starting in 4th grade parents may check their student's grades online with "SchoolCues". It is the parent's responsibility to monitor their child's progress through "SchoolCues". Information on "SchoolCues" will be given out at the beginning of the school year.


PARENT TEACHER CONFERENCES

Parent-Teacher Conferences are scheduled during the school year. The first is required and will be after the first grading period to allow parents and teachers alike to share the student's progress. A second conference is optional and will be scheduled after the second grading period if necessary. This ensures appropriate teacher-parent communication on the student's progress prior to the end of the school year.

The teacher will be available to the parents for communication in scheduled meetings as needed. However, *this may not be during the teacher's instruction or lunch time*. Please schedule appointments with the teacher after 2:00 p.m.

<u>HOMEWORK</u>

Homework will be sent home regularly. Our homework policy, in general, is ten minutes times the grade level through 5th grade. This could vary. We believe homework is important to a child's education because:



- 2. It reinforces concepts that are being learned.
- 3. It allows the child independence while requiring responsibility for their work.
- 4. It shows what a child is learning and encourages additional parental involvement in a child's education.



STUDENT HEALTH REOUIREMENTS

All students attending Cornerstone Christian School <u>must have</u> the following on record with the school office:

- 1. A **current immunization record or an exemption statement** according to Idaho Code, before entering school in the fall. Standard immunization record forms may be obtained from your family doctor and a copy given to the school office.
- 2. Medical Release/Emergency form (sent to you in the August email) describes the basic health/illness history of each student including the medication taken during the school day. This also lists the names and phone numbers of people who may need notification in a medical emergency if we cannot reach you.
- Before the school will issue any <u>prescription</u> medication to a student, we must receive written parental permission.
- Note: Since we do not provide the usual screening services, i.e. vision, scoliosis, etc., we recommend regular physical exams by your family physician.

Registration and fees are due April 5

Enrollment of children in Cornerstone Christian School is a privilege. Parents must understand that continued *enrollment* and reenrollment of their children is dependent on their support of the school, its staff and its policies.

Students should evidence ageappropriate stability, attention span, and self-discipline.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

***Please understand that we plan classes and hire teachers according to registration. It is important that our classroom numbers are accurate in order to maintain an appropriate budget.

- 1. Registration and fees must be turned in by April 5. A late fee will be added after this date.
- 2. Priority for admission of new students will be determined as follows:
 - a. Children of Cornerstone Christian School employees.
 - b. Siblings of current Cornerstone Christian School students.
 - c. Previously unaffiliated students will be admitted according to available space.
- 3. All new K-8 students shall be screened before admission. The purpose of the screening is to help determine the academic level of the prospective student. There may be a parent interview with the school administrator. The student may also have a teacher interview.
- 4. Our 7th-8th grade program is a two year curriculum. New 8th graders will not be admitted except through approval of the administrative team.
- 5. The mission and ministry of Cornerstone Christian School are based on traditional orthodox Christian doctrine and beliefs. We use the Bible as our only source of faith and practice. Because part of our mission is evangelism to salvation through faith in Jesus Christ <u>alone</u>, the Board reserves the right to not accept any applications of parents who profess religious beliefs that deviate or extend beyond the scripture.
- 6. All new students are on academic and behavioral probation during the first grading period.
- 7. After review of the application documents by the administrative team, a letter notifying acceptance/denial will be mailed by April 19.
- 8. A kindergarten child must be five (5) by August 31, and a first grader must be six (6) by August 31, and so on. Any child entering Cornerstone Christian School from another school should be performing at grade level. If it is found that a student cannot keep up with grade level materials, the administrative team will require that child to be placed in the appropriate grade.
- 9. Transfers into Cornerstone Christian School during the school year are limited. The decision to accept new families is by approval of the administrative team. The cost of curriculum and the adjustment of classrooms are not conducive to mid-year transfers.
- 10. Any family that registers after April 5 but before school begins, will be accepted only through administrative team approval. This allows us to order the appropriate materials and hire the appropriate teachers in preparation for an excellent school year.
- 11. If the school does not accept a student, or if there is no room for the student in the correct grade level, the school will refund the registration fee. If the parents voluntarily withdraw a child, the registration fee is non-refundable.
- 12. Tuition must be up-to-date by April 5 for your registration to be accepted.

DISCIPLINE POLICY

Cornerstone Christian School seeks to provide a positive, safe environment conducive to the teaching/learning process. Students are urged to develop behaviors through self-discipline in all areas of school life and to observe the rules of the school. We do try to hold students accountable, however, the ideal environment does not exist.

These behaviors are expected at all times:

Respect shown to all students, staff members and parents.

Honesty in all school situations. Dishonesty includes lying, cheating and stealing.

Obedience in response to all directions and instructions given by staff members or parents.

Physical Control is expected. Actions which intentionally harm others, and actions which disrupt classroom atmosphere will not be allowed.

Appropriate Language will be expressed. Obscene or profane language, as well as taking the Lord's name in vain, will warrant disciplinary action.

***Cornerstone Christian School does not receive government funding and is not equipped to handle students with significant emotional or behavioral issues. If a child is unable to control his or her behavior or causes a threat or danger to other children, the child will be dismissed from the program.

GENERAL DISCIPLINE PROCEDURE

- When there is a concern about a student, the parent will be contacted. Parents are encouraged to discipline in a way they feel will most influence the child.
- 2. If several contacts have occurred, the teacher may ask for a meeting. The parent, teacher and administration may come up with a plan best suited to the situation. This could include recess adjustments, an apology letter, sentence writing, a parent monitoring in the classroom or suspension.
- 3. If the behavior continues, the board may expel the student from the school.

Note: If, at any time, a child's behavior warrants immediate intervention, a parent will be required to remove their child from the school premises for the remainder of the day.

All discipline will be monitored with love and concern for the individual child. All measures mentioned will be used in trying to correct a child, but an orderly classroom environment will be maintained.

Student Insurance

The school does not provide insurance for students who are involved in accidents at school. Parents are responsible to provide insurance for their student if/ when they are injured at school either through homeowner's insurance or another health policy the family carries.

Lost & Found

Clothing or items of value should be clearly labeled with your student's name. Properly labeled items will be returned to the owner. Our "Lost and Found" is located in the resource room. Unclaimed items will be either given to charity or put in our uniform exchange.

We do not send out tuition statements. Tuition should be received by the 10th of each month. Please earmark your checks to denote the account to be credited. (last name or student's name) Any use of credit cards will have an added fee .


Wearable technology that does not connect to texting/social media/internet is allowed.

Resolution of Problems/Conflicts

When working through problems or conflicts between families, students and parents are expected to talk directly with the individual involved in a situation before appealing to a higher authority. Only after making this attempt without satisfactory results should they talk with the administrator in order to work toward a solution.

When addressing concerns with the teacher, initial contact should be made with the child's teacher. Parents are expected to work with the teacher before approaching the administrator. The teacher will listen to the concern(s) and address the issue(s). If this conference does not result in a resolution, the next step is to contact the administrator.

If the administrator cannot help parents resolve a situation, they may then request a closed hearing with the School Board. The School Board will set the date, time, and place of the hearing. A concise written explanation of the concern(s) must be provided to the School Board at least a week before the meeting.

It is important to follow the "Matthew 18 Principle" if we are going to conduct ourselves in a manner that will honor God (and His work) and promote respect and constructive behavior in our relations. If you become dissatisfied with the school, seek to resolve the matter. Always go to the person(s) involved. Guard against spreading criticism and developing a bitter attitude.

CCS Student Dress Code

- Uniforms are required.
- No hats are allowed inside the school unless it is otherwise specified by a teacher for a school event.
- The only acceptable body piercings allowed are earnings.
- Makeup or hairstyles that are of unnatural colorization are not allowed.
- Long sleeved shirts are not to be worn under short sleeved polos.
- Students are allowed to leave their shirts untucked. There should not be any bottoms, boxers or undies showing when they bend over. Shirts that are too big will need to be tucked in. We want to preserve a uniform look.
 Shirts must be tucked in on chapel days.

Non-Uniform Day Policy

No jeans or pants with holes.

Tops should be modest, shoulders must be covered.

No inappropriate tops. (words, logos, pictures).

Shorts and skirts should be no more than three inches above the knee.


